# March 2023 Legislative Report Vice President Wanda Buttner

#### **Galveston County Legislative Priorities 2023**

We the Commissioners Court of Galveston County, support the following Legislative measures:

**Property Appraisal Reform:** Provide real property tax relief by reforming the property appraisal system that drives large yearly assessments increases and creates heavy tax burdens on property owners

**Elimination Of County Treasurer Office:** Reduce the size and cost of local government by allowing Galveston County voters to decide on eliminating the office of Galveston Co. Treasurer.

**SH 99/Grand Parkway Project:** Support the completion of the Grand Parkway that will serve as an important hurricane evacuation route, increase mobility, reduce traffic congestion and increase economic development.

**Navigation District Reform:** Ensure no navigation district owns property outside of the defined jurisdiction. Specifically, guaranteed that Galveston County is free from ownership of the outside ports and navigation districts by amending Sec. 62.1071 of the Water Code.

**<u>Drainage Projects:</u>** Provide additional funding for drainage projects in Galveston County, including support for projects in the lower Clear Creek and Dickinson Bayou watersheds.

<u>County Ordinance Power in Unincorporated Areas</u>: Pass effective solutions that grant counties limited ordinance powers to mitigate flood control, nuisance abatement, and protect transportation infrastructure and public safety.

**Provide Additional Nuisance Abatement Authority to Counties:** Amend Transportation Code Subchapter A. Sec. 396.001 to include automotive shops in the category with automotive wrecking and salvages yards.

**Mental Health funding:** Provide funding for mental health and substance abuse programs, especially for mental health beds and treatment.

**Additional Funding for Specialty Courts:** Increase support and funding for specialty courts that improve outcomes for Justice-involved residents that suffer from mental health challenges or substance abuse.

**Protect Funding for Pelican Island Bridge:** Add the Pelican Island Bridge to the Texas Department of Transportation's list of maintained bridges and protect the \$57.5 million currently allocated to replacing the bridge. This bridge connects Pelican Island and Galveston Island

**Expand OSSF Allowances in Administrative Code:** Encourage additional development in unique areas, such as the Bolivar Peninsula, by adding language to 30 Administrative Code, Chapter 285, Subchapter A, Rule 285.4.

Public Notices: Expand the allowance of digital public notices.

**County Magistrates:** Amend Sec 2.09 of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure to allow the Galveston County Commissioners Court to directly hire magistrates.


<u>Uniform Work Hours:</u> Amend Sec 157.021 of the Texas Local Government Code to reduce the population threshold from 355,000 to 350,000 or allow usage of Census estimates to determine population.





Sylvia Horne Vice President of Programs introduced our speaker Cheryl Johnson the Galveston County Tax Assessor Collector. Cheryl will tell us how she is doing work for us in Austin and how we can be more active and involved.

Cheryl thanked us for having her and said she has been our County Tax Assessor Collector for 18 years. Starting her presentation she mentioned that she brought handouts and she gave a little background on the legislature. Cheryl's slide show of charts detailed a wealth of statistics and information and included how to navigate the Texas Legislature website. Cheryl advised us how bills are drafted and filed, what process the bills go through to eventually get to the Governor for his signature into law. Last session 6,927 bills were filed, 1,073 were passed, 21 vetoed by the Governor and only 15% of the total bills were passed into law. She suggested that we pick an interest, look at the bills addressing that interest, (type in Texas Legislature Online) peruse the website, save the bills of interest and follow them through the process. She gave us many examples of how to get informed for ourselves and what we can to do to make our voices heard. Sylvia presented Cheryl with a gift.

Commissioner Joe Gusti provided the phone number 785-577-4649 for anyone wishing to take the bus to Austin on March 1<sup>st</sup> for Texas Day at the Capitol.

Betty thanked everyone for coming and wished safe travels back to their destinations. She thanked the chef, servers and staff of the San Luis for our delicious food, lovely room and expert service and ended the meeting with God Bless You All, God Bless America and God Bless Texas.
