- ALL volunteer political activities whether paid or unpaid (election worker, poll watcher, election integrity worker). NOTE: Individuals who are salaried campaign and/or GOP professional staff DO NOT qualify.

- **Running for office** as a Republican candidate.
- Working at local/state/county/national offices (candidate/elected official office)
- Serving as elected member of your Local, State or National Party Committee
- Walking precincts, preparing letters to the editor or elected officials, phone calling, radio, TV and social media appearances, posting to social media, voter registration, writing or editing a digital or hardcopy club newsletter, attendance at rallies.
- Working on any aspect of a Republican campaign (partisan or non-partisan).
- Working on Republican ballot questions, initiatives, or petitions.

Nearly 800 New Laws Have Taken Effect

• While several pieces of Republican priority legislation have been delayed due to lawsuits, 774 new laws went into effect in Texas on Friday.

A new corporate welfare program, "Texas Jobs, Energy, Technology, and Innovation Act," is now in place. It is a new statewide economic incentive program replacing the state's controversial Chapter 313 program, which ended after lawmakers <u>declined</u> to renew it two years ago.

A law banning child gender mutilation procedures is now in effect despite legal opposition in state court. The same goes for legislation providing regulatory certainty for businesses, which had been confronting an increasingly hostile patchwork of contradictory local regulations.

 As <u>Sydnie Henry reports</u>, none of those new laws provide for significant border security. Only <u>six</u> of the new laws are even tangentially related to the ongoing border crisis.

New Law Requires Texas Schools to Hire Security Guards

- With the 2023-2024 school year already underway, a new law will soon require
 Texas school districts and charter schools to <u>hire at least one armed security</u>
 guard for every campus.
- The new law requires schools to provide training to an armed security officer employed by the district using state funds.
- The district's board of trustees will determine the appropriate number of armed security officers for each school. However, the law stipulates that at least one armed guard must be in every school during regular school hours.
- The measure also requires school district leadership to meet regularly with their law enforcement counterparts to discuss any emergency preparedness and action plans needed to keep students safe.

Biden May Force Illegal Aliens to Remain in Texas

- Reports from Washington indicate the Biden administration is considering new rules that would force illegal aliens to remain in Texas while awaiting asylum screening. Emily Medeiros reports that border patrol agents encountered 183,503 illegal aliens in July, rising by almost 40,000 since June.
- The Biden plan would allegedly force illegal aliens to remain in Texas—or other border states—by tracking their location through GPS monitoring devices, like ankle bracelets. The program places illegal alien families under a strict curfew and requires at least one family member to wear a GPS monitoring device.
- The administration has presented no plans to curb the inflow of illegal aliens.

Texans for Fiscal Responsibility Calls for Special Session to Eliminate Property Taxes

- As Texas lawmakers gear up for a special legislative session focused on education, Texans for Fiscal Responsibility is asking Gov. Greg Abbott to prioritize property tax elimination. Katy Marshall has the story.
- TFR said they support Abbott calling a special session on education freedom "so long as it is directed towards real, fiscally sound, education freedom for *all* Texas families."
- However, the group also asked Abbott to include "legislation that provides a pathway to property tax elimination, a cause that you have publicly supported in the recent past."

Texas Senate voted to acquit Attorney General Ken Paxton on all impeachment charges.

- After signaling that he would call for an audit into the impeachment trial expenses shortly after the verdict on Saturday, Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick has now officially made the request.
- To be clear, the goal is to determine the absolute total cost to the state of preparing for and conducting this trial from the beginning through its conclusion, wrote Patrick. "This must detail all expenses, including but not limited to, investigators' expenses, document production and assembly, attorney expenses, witness fees, travel, food and lodging."
