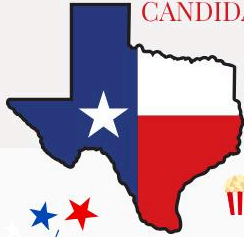

71st Anniversary Celebration Thursday, May 14th at the San Luis Hotel & Resort – Main Ball Room, 5222 Seawall Blvd., Galveston, TX

President Irene Henry called the meeting to order at 7PM and welcomed everyone.

Irene asked Marcy Hanson, Chaplain, to lead us in the opening prayer.

Irene asked Dr. Greg Bonnen, Texas House Rep, Dist. 24, to lead us in saying the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States of America and Pledge of Allegiance to the State of Texas. Following the pledges, Dr. Bonnen graciously commended GRW for all their great work.

Irene, first, asked all the Elected Officials to stand and introduce themselves and then all the Candidates.

Irene began the evening by saying: "Tonight, we are here to celebrate GRW's 71st Anniversary. Let's pause a moment and think about what was happening in Galveston in 1955.

KEY POLITICAL/SOCIAL DEVELOPMENTS IN 1955

1. **Galveston was a "Free State"** widely known for illegal gambling, bootlegging, prostitution and, at times, ineffectual police force, often managed by the influence of the Maceo family;
2. **Civil Rights & Community:** John Henry Clouser was promoting for desegregation and educators' rights; and,
3. **Infrastructure & Development:** The Episcopal Diocese of Texas was expanding. They had plans for the St. Vincent's House.

STATE VS LOCAL FACTIONALISM ("Shivercrats")

Galveston was deeply entangled in a larger civil war within the Texas Democratic Party. Governor Allan Shivers led the conservative "Shivercrats", who had supported Republican Dwight D. Eisenhower federally while maintaining control of the state's Democratic machinery.

1. **The Precinct Battles:** In late 1955, Galveston political clubs and precinct leaders actively mobilized for the upcoming 1956 conventions. Liberal "loyalist" Democrats in Galveston worked to wrest control from the Shivercrat faction, clashing over issues of racial integration, labor unions and state control over local land and tidelands. There was a Lot going on! The tide was changing;
2. **There became a Rise of Organized Opposition:** May 18th, 1955, a young lady by the name of Patti Swann invited a group of ladies to her home and they talked about issues at hand. During that meeting, she recruited 28 women to become members of a Republican Women club. The club was named Galveston Republican Women and the dues were \$1.00 per member; and
3. **The Rise of Republican Women:** In October 1955, Texas conservative women met to form the Texas Federation of Republican Women (TFRW), This mobilization was heavily felt in urbanizing coastal areas like Galveston County, which flipped the vote for Eisenhower in 1956. These groups of strong, determined, energized conservative ladies had a mission and that mission, OUR MISSION, continues on today.

Recognition of Past Presidents: Irene pointed out that the names of Past Presidents were listed on the inside cover of this evenings' agenda; many of whom were in attendance this evening: Cathy Frederickson, Betty Henry, Jeannie Koenig, Sylvia Horne and Irene Henry.

Newsletter: Irene recognized Landa for doing a good job in upgrading the newsletter. Names of people, who participated in the survey on the newsletter, were placed on a "Survey Spinning Wheel". Carol Jean Mulrain won the April Survey Contest.

Program: Irene asked Dr. Levy Walpole to come up and introduce the guest speaker: T.J. Aulds is the founder and owner of i45NOW, the Galveston Bay Area's largest media outlet with more than 1 million viewers every month. The Galveston County native is entering his 45th year as a journalist (yes, his first paying gig was to write Obituaries for his mother's newspaper when he was 13 and read cop news for his father's radio station). Locally he has worked for The Galveston Daily News, The Texas City Sun, KGBC-Radio, KHOU-TV, News 24 Houston and KNWS and had national positions with Associated Press, CNN and was for three years paid to go to baseball games as a senior producer for the Houston Astros TV network. The University of Texas Advertising/Marketing major's work has been featured in the New York Times, FOX News, Los Angeles Times, Time Magazine, Popular Mechanics, News Nation, ABC, CBS, NBC and the BBC. He's also been a featured news expert on multiple news magazines including 48 Hours, Discovery Channel, Court TV and more than 15 other history and crime shows.

Irene thanked T.J. Aulds and Levy presented him with a gift.

Irene asked Jan Broussard to bring up the raffle tickets: Linda Buckley won a book, "The 250 Reason to Love America" and Judge Kathleen McCumber won a 250 Anniversary writing pen.

Irene asked Galveston Police Officer Hines to lead us in "God Bless America".

Meeting was adjourned at 8:30 pm.

I wanted to provide a brief update on several important matters.

Legislative Priorities

Our Legislative Priorities are currently being reviewed by Vergel Cruz, the full report will be released next week. However, here are the top eight priorities voted on by our delegates:

I am pleased to announce our temporary RPT Legal Team:

I am grateful for their willingness to serve the Party during this transition and help us move forward.

Finances

As I shared during the SREC meeting, my first priority as Chair was to begin an audit so we could understand our true financial position. After meeting with the bank and reviewing account balances, our initial numbers indicate the convention alone resulted in a large deficit with concerns raised by our Treasurers, Ralph Fite and Adolpho Telles, during convention.

I campaigned on the belief that our finances were not healthy. What I did not know was the extent of the challenge. I have now provided our Treasurers full access to the records necessary to conduct the audit. We expect that audit to be completed within two weeks, and I will keep you informed as information becomes available.

I am asking for your help. If you can introduce me to donors or provide opportunities to share our vision for the future of the Republican Party of Texas, I would greatly appreciate it. Restoring our financial strength will require all of us working together.

Most importantly, I believe unity drives victory.

Over the last several months, I have spoken with Republicans from across Texas. Regardless of region or faction, I hear the same thing: they are tired of the infighting. Republicans want to focus on winning. We know that the infighting only distracts us from that mission. The Democrats would love for us to destroy each other from within. We aren't going to give them that.

I look forward to working alongside each of you as we strengthen our Party financially, expand our reach, and deliver historic victories for Republicans across Texas.

Governor Abbott Launches New App

Governor Abbott Launches Abbott Impact App at the Texas Federation of Republican Women Award Luncheon in San Antonio

Oct 24, 2025

Celebrates the TFRW's 70th Anniversary

SAN ANTONIO – Governor Greg Abbott today launched the Abbott Impact App during his keynote address at the Texas Federation of Republican Women (TFRW) Awards Luncheon. The new app, available in both the [Apple App](#) and [Google Play](#) stores provides a critical tool that empowers conservatives to turn out Republican voters ahead of the November 2026 election.

"Today, I want to announce the Abbott Impact app," said Governor Abbott. "This will allow you to match your contacts to the Texas voter file and see which of your Republican friends have voted. For those who haven't, you can contact them directly in the app, post reminders on social media, and help get out the vote for conservative candidates. This will be one of our key tools this election to ensure that Texas remains bright red."

The Governor also celebrated the 70th anniversary of TFRW, praising their decades of leadership and tireless work in delivering conservative victories across Texas.

"The Texas Federation of Republican Women charted a course for the future of politics in Texas," Governor Abbott said. "Because of what they started, Texas has become the largest Republican state in the United States of America."

The Governor was joined by TFRW President Zenia Warren and TFRW Awards Chair Patty Castillo, as well as other state officials, TFRW leaders, and conservative activists.

During his keynote address, Governor Abbott touted the conservative successes from the 89th Legislative Session, including strengthening parental rights, banning DEI, and reforming Texas' broken bail system. He also noted that TFRW's work is more important now than ever before, as liberal Democrats plan to spend millions of dollars to flip Texas blue ahead of the November 2026 election.

The Abbott Impact app is a new tool for Republican activists and volunteers to help turn out the vote and make a difference. The app matches a user's contact list to the Texas voter file, allowing Texans to personally reach out to friends who haven't voted and share voting reminders directly on social media. Texans can download the Abbott Impact app today to help keep Texas strong, conservative, and red.

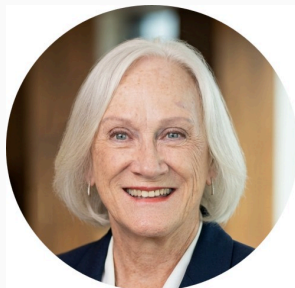
GRW Road Trip to Austin
